- Who established the group?
- Who manages and controls the group's activities?

GROUPS NOT SUBJECT TO FACCA

	Composed wholly of full-time or permanent part-time officers or employees of the Federal Government
	In which each person provides individual advice; there is no collective advice
	Information exchange/fact gathering
	Meetings initiated by a group to express their views
